Location

- Moremi Game Reserve
- Nestled beneath a lush green woodland canopy, Camp Moremi, in the Xakanaxa area of Moremi Game Reserve, is truly hidden gem
- GPS Co-ordinates S19° 12' 51.85 E 023° 25' 56.0

Seasons

- Summer: September – April
- Winter: May – August
- Closed for 1 month during the rainy season (January-March) for refurbishments and maintenance

Game Viewing

- At the point where the life-giving waters of the Okavango Delta meet the vast plains of the Kalahari Desert, Mother Nature has created a sanctuary of Mopane forests, open grasslands, seasonal floodplains and riverine habitats, resulting in one of the most magnificent and welcoming animal environments in all of Africa
- Activities centre around tracking big game on morning and afternoon game drives by open 4x4 safari vehicle in the Moremi Game Reserve, renowned for frequent sightings of lion, leopard and cheetah, as well as wild dog, whose numbers are so rapidly dwindling in other areas
- Exploring the Xakanaxa Lagoon and surrounding Okavango channels by motorboat, affords guests exceptional bird-watching opportunities, as birdlife is prolific and varied, ranging from water birds to shy forest dwellers

Accessibility

- **Air** – Xakanaxa airstrip is served by Safari Air charter aircraft from Maun International Airport (IATA:MUB) and Kasane Airport (IATA:BBK)
- **Road** – 140kms from Maun on sandy roads suitable for 4WD vehicles only, approximately a four hours' drive



Camp Moremi Airstrip Details

- Xakanaxa Airstrip is managed by Chobe Holdings
- Airstrip GPS Co-ordinates S19° 11' 19.96 E 023° 24' 30.48
- The airstrip is a registered Class B airstrip and can accommodate aircraft up to 5700kg
- Airstrip length: 900m
- Depending on the time of year and safety restrictions on individual runways, groups may be split up due to safety reasons
- Please note there is a limit of 20kg's per person (including hand luggage) in SOFT BAGS (No hard bags or soft bags with hard wheel bases allowed e.g.: Samsonite's)

Xakanaxa Airstrip to Camp Moremi Road Transfer

A road transfer of approximately 25 minutes to camp

Flying Times

- To/from Maun: 25 minutes
- To/from Kasane: 75 minutes
- To/from Camp Okavango and Xugana Island Lodge: 15 minutes
- To/from Savute Safari Lodge: 35 minutes
- To/from Leroo La Tau: 55 minutes

Accommodation

12 Custom style safari tents on raised platforms consisting of:

- 11 x twin bedded tents
- 1 x Family suite (Consisting of two bedrooms)
- 1 x guide/pilot tent

The camp can accommodate a maximum of 24 guests

In the booking system the safari tents are listed as standard rooms and the family suite listed as a family room

Family room details

- Luxurious custom safari tents raised on teak platforms with bush views
- En-suite bathroom comprising of a shower, vanity and toilet, and second bathroom with shower, vanity and toilet
- Private teak viewing decks off each room
- Fans in all guest rooms (no air conditioners due to the amount of electricity needed to run these units)
- 220V Plug points for charging equipment
- A range of African bio degradable soaps, conditioning shampoo, hand wash, body lotion with insect repellent and shower caps are supplied in each room
- A hairdryer is available from the lodge reception
- Gowns supplied in each room
- Flashlight available in each room
- Umbrella's for the rainy season
- Battery operated reading lights, desk light and bathroom light at night
- Small safe for valuables
- Emergency air horn for emergency situations

Camp Description

- Shaded from the African sun by a forest of tall Ebony trees
- Elegant thatch and timber lodge consisting of an elevated main lounge, wildlife reference library, cocktail bar and a dining area which serves individually plated starters and desserts and buffet-style main courses
- An elevated viewing platform with a breath-taking panorama of Xakanaxa Lagoon
- Thatched boma where guests can enjoy morning breakfast, brunch and afternoon tea
- Curio shop
- Secluded swimming pool and sundeck

Activities

- Game Drives with open safari Land Cruisers
- Motorised boating trips
- Exceptional bird watching opportunities

Suggested Daily Activity Schedule

Winter (April – September)

- 05h30 - Early morning wakeup call
- 06h00 - Light continental breakfast is served in the boma
- 06h30 - Leave for morning activity (approximately 3-4 hours)
- 11h30 - Brunch is served at the boma
- 15h00 - Afternoon tea is served at the boma
- 15h30 - Depart for afternoon activity (approximately 3 hours)
- 18h30 - Arrive back at lodge
- 19h30 - Dinner is served at the dining area



Summer (October – March)

- 05h00 - Early morning wakeup call
- 05h30 - Light continental breakfast is served in the boma
- 06h00 - Leave for morning activity (approximately 3-4 hours)
- 11h00 - Brunch is served at the boma
- 15h30 - Afternoon tea is served at the boma
- 16h00 - Depart for afternoon activity (approximately 3 hours)
- 19h00 - Arrive back at lodge
- 20h00 - Dinner is served at the dining area

Electricity & Water

- Camp Moremi operates on AC 220V generator power which is available during the day and evening
- Guest accommodation is equipped with a 220-volt AC plug which is suitable for hairdryers and the recharging of camera and video batteries
- The generator is switched off at night and inverted 12-volt DC lighting provides room and bathroom illumination overnight
- Ceiling fans are fitted in all the guest rooms in our camps. Unfortunately due to the remoteness of our camps it is not possible to run air conditioners due to the amount of power required to do so.

Communication

To allow for the full peacefulness and relaxation whilst on safari, there is no access to WiFi or telephones. The camps do however have a guest computer situated in the lounge area, which guests can use to access the internet via satellite link up, which can be slow. In terms of telephonic communication, each camp has a satellite phone in the event of emergency situations.

Requirements for Minors Travelling through all Botswana ports of entry

Effective from 1st October 2016 minors travelling through the country's borders will be required to produce certified copies Of unabridged birth certificates in addition to their valid passports. In the event that one parent is not travelling with the Child, the other parent's affidavit consenting to such travel should be availed. However an affidavit will not be required if The father's name does not appear on the child's birth certificate.

Pricing / Child Policy

- **Green Season:** December to March
- **Shoulder Season:** April to June and November
- **High Season:** July to October
- Children over the age of 6 years are welcome. Families with children aged 6-11 will be required to book private activities at an additional cost
- The family room comprises of two rooms which are inter-leading. One is en-suite, the second bedroom can accommodate a third child on a roll out bed
- Should a family consist of three or more children, the request will be subject to the age of the child and the availability at the time of the enquiry

Evacuation Policy and Medical Information

- Emergency medical evacuation cover included
- Guests who are highly allergic to bee stings and/or insect bites, who have been advised by their medical practitioners to use an epinephrine autoinjector or epipen, should always ensure that they are carrying their own device with them when they travel. Due to individual dosages required by people requiring extreme treatment, and the risk of over or under dosage, Epinephrine autoinjectors are not stocked or provided within our camps/lodges first aid equipment

Drinks Policy

- All local branded drinks are included in the nightly rate

Laundry Policy

- Laundry is done on a daily basis and inclusive in the nightly rate

Extras Payment

- Curios and tips/gratuities can be billed to the room number and settled on check out. Payment can be made by cash (ZAR, US\$, British Sterling, Euro and Pula) or the following credit cards: Visa or MasterCard

Gratuity

- Tipping at own discretion. Our suggested guideline is US\$ 10.00 per person per day for General Camp Staff which goes into a central tipping box and US\$ 10.00 per person per day to the Guide
