Where is Cottar's Safaris located?

Cottar's Safaris - comprising **Cottar's 1920s Camp** and **Cottar's Bush Villa** - is **located** in the Maasai Mara within the exclusive Olderkesi Conservancy, a 7,608-acre private wilderness in Kenya that borders the famous Maasai Mara National Reserve, the Serengeti, and Loliondo reserves.

The Olderkesi Conservancy is the only private-use conservancy in the Maasai Mara, offering guests unrivalled access to one of Africa's most wildlife-rich regions and ensuring a truly exclusive safari experience, with no congestion at wildlife sightings.

How many days should I plan to stay at Cottar's Safaris?

We recommend staying at Cottar's Safaris (either at Cottar's 1920s Camp or Cottar's Bush Villa) for a minimum of three nights to fully immerse yourself in the safari experience. Many of our guests choose to stay longer and combine their time with other properties in East and Southern Africa.

How do I get to Cottar's Safaris?

To get to Cottar's 1920s Camp and Cottar's Bush Villa, you will typically fly internationally into Jomo Kenyatta International Airport (JKIA) in Nairobi. From there, and then transfer to Wilson Airport, Kenya's domestic airport (allow for adequate transfer time), where you will take a smaller aircraft for your journey to the Maasai Mara, either via a scheduled flight or private charter flight.

Flying directly to [Cottar's Safaris private airstrip](#) is the most convenient and direct option. However, some flights may instead land at Keekorok Airstrip, which is approximately a two-hour scenic safari drive from Cottar's Safaris. Our preferred domestic airline for domestic flights is Governor's Aviation, as they guarantee to land at Cottar's Safaris with a minimum of 2 passengers.

Do I need a visa?

Yes, Kenya requires an e-visa otherwise known as an Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA) for many nationalities prior to arrival.

You can apply online at etakenya.go.ke. However, it is worth noting that the application process can be rather cumbersome. If you are staying with Cottar's Safaris, we have created a helpful guide to assist you with your visa application. See [HERE](#).

When is the best time to visit the Maasai Mara?

Cottar's Safaris is a year-round destination, offering exceptional wildlife and safari experiences in every season.

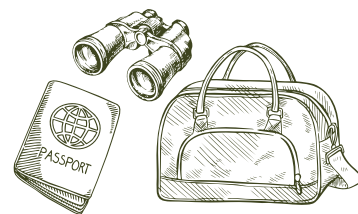
The Maasai Mara enjoys a mild and pleasant climate throughout the year, thanks to its elevation of 1,500–1,900 meters (4,900–6,200 feet) above sea level. Average temperatures in the Maasai Mara are around 21°C, with the coolest nights dropping to 11°C in July, and the hottest day temperature reaching up to 28°C in February. Each season offers its own unique highlights:

Private Season (April to May, and November to mid-December). This is a wonderfully quiet time to visit, with fewer people and significantly lower rates. Wildlife sightings remain excellent, with opportunities to see newborn animals. Big cats are particularly easy to spot during the private season, as they stand out against the lush green grasslands.

High Season (mid-January to March, and the first half of June). Following the rains, the savannah begins to flourish in preparation for the Great Migration. It is a wonderful time for walking, night wildlife drives and birdwatching. February and March are the hottest months of the year, while June has some of the best temperate weather. Wildlife sightings remain excellent, with the Big 5 still present.

Peak Season (mid-June through to October). This is the most popular time to visit, coinciding with the Great Migration - a world-renowned natural phenomenon where over a million wildebeest, zebra, and other animals move through the landscape. It is the best time to witness dramatic river crossing and predator-prey interactions.

Are vaccinations required for travel to Kenya?

Yellow fever and malaria precautions are often recommended for travel to Kenya. Yellow fever vaccination is mandatory if you are arriving from, or transiting through, a country where Yellow Fever is present. We advise that you consult your doctor at least one month prior to departure, as individual medical and vaccination recommendations may vary.

What animals will I see in the Maasai Mara?

You will see an abundance of wildlife in the Maasai Mara, often referred to as the 7th Wonder of the Natural World. The Maasai Mara is home to the iconic 'Big 5' (lion, rhino, elephant, buffalo and leopard) and is famous for the Great Migration, the annual, awe-inspiring movement of over 1.5 million wildebeest, zebras, and gazelles crossing from Tanzania's Serengeti into Kenya's Maasai Mara in search of fresh grazing. Common sightings include, lions, elephants, leopards, cheetahs, buffalo, giraffes, zebras, hippos, crocodiles, with the occasional sightings of rhinos and wild dogs. This epic journey includes dramatic river crossings and intense predator encounters along the way - making it one of the most spectacular wildlife events on Earth.



What's the daily schedule?

At Cottar's Safaris, there is no fixed daily schedule. Each day is tailored to suit our guests' individual needs and interests, drawing from over 20 **award-winning, impact-driven activities** to create a highly personalised and memorable experience. From wildlife drives, sundowners, spa treatments, e-biking, conservation talks on the plight of raptors, to our unique Maasai Warrior School, you can enjoy a wide range of enriching and exciting experiences throughout your stay with us.

Is going on safari safe?

At Cottar's Safaris we prioritise the wellbeing and safety of all our guests. We have expert guides, health and safety trained staff, access to a medical doctor on call, and an abundance of positive, joyful, safe experiences. While you will be in close proximity to wild animals we provide a comprehensive safety briefing on arrival, as well as in our in-room information booklet. We kindly ask all guests to follow our safety instructions to ensure a secure and enjoyable stay at Cottar's Safaris.



What's the difference between a lodge, Cottar's 1920s Camp and Cottar's Bush Villa?

We don't have a lodge, as lodges are typically geared towards mass tourism and this does not align with our ethos. At Cottar's Safaris, we offer a more intimate, luxury glamping experience that brings guests closer to nature while still enjoying modern comforts. Cottar's 1920s Camp features 11 tented suites - comprises five luxury double tents, four spacious family tents (each with two en-suite bedrooms connected by a shared living area and a large outdoor deck), and two romantic honeymoon tents. For those seeking even greater exclusivity, the exclusive-use Cottar's Bush Villa - voted Best Private Villa in Africa and the World Travel Awards - offers private, luxury accommodation for up to 10 guests in five en-suite bedrooms. The villa comes with its own staff, guiding team, private safari vehicle, chef and also boasts a 25-meter private swimming pool.

What about electricity on safari?

Electricity in Kenya runs on 240 volts. The most common wall sockets are the British-style rectangular three-prong. Two-pin plugs can fit into these as well. For charging your devices, an international travel adaptor is recommended in case your equipment does not fit the available sockets.

How should I prepare and what should I pack?

Below is a very short list of suggestions for what to pack. Please note that many of the domestic flights in Kenya only allow 15 kgs of luggage (total), so efficient packing is necessary. For a more detailed list of what to pack please see [HERE](#).

- Neutral-colored clothing

- Binoculars, camera, extra batteries

We manage our camp in an ecologically responsible way including solar energy, an organic garden, recycling, zero single plastics policy, the use of rainwater harvesting, and asking our guests to help us with reforestation and adopt best practices for the environment, socio, and cultural aspects of our business.
