


SELF-DRIVE DIRECTIONS FROM **SESFONTEIN**TO **HOANIB VALLEY CAMP**

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOU HAVE THE FOLLOWING FOR THE SELF-DRIVE ROUTES TO HOANIB VALLEY CAMP.

- I. Satellite Phone: Camp Number: +264 83 700 0202
- 2. High ground clearance vehicle and tyre changing equipment.

Should you feel lost, please contact the lodge and we will come look for you.



RECOMMENDED 4X4 ROUTE FROM SESFONTEIN TO HOANIB VALLEY CAMP

- Drive through Sesfontein on the D3707
- After about 30 kilometres, you will reach Ganamub village continue through the village. Please don't continue on the main road as this leads to Purros.
- Approximately 5 kilometres into the open plains, you will see a small green sign with HVC on it next to a dead tree. Turn left into the plains.
- After the turn off to the plains, stick to the main road for 30 kilometres. Do not take any
 turn-offs to either side of the road and continue in the dry Obias river bed. Once through the
 canyons, you will get to the lodge entrance with a sign for the lodge and a giraffe painting on a
 rock.

Turn right onto the entrance road.

ALTERNATIVE 4X4 ROUTE FROM SESFONTEIN TO HOANIB VALLEY CAMP

- Drive through Sesfontein on the D3707
- After 10 kilometres, turn left at the Elephant Song signpost.
- Continue for approximately 20 kilometres to the gate and Elephant Song campsite
- Enter Hoanib River and continue another 10 kilometres until you drive though a narrow gorge. Continue in the river bed following the meanders of the Hoanib River.
- After about 8 kilometres after passing the gorge, be on lookout for a small green board with HVC on it on the northern bank of the river. This is where you will exit the river.
- Once out of the river, follow the road leading north up the Obias River for about 3 kilometres and turn left for the lodge. There is giraffe painting on the turn off to the lodge.
