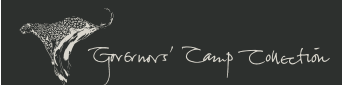

## About

Governors' Camp is **Africa's first permanent luxury tented camp**, remaining in its original site since 1972.

Deliberately unfenced to create no barrier between the camp and this prime wildlife location, guests can enjoy intimate and thrilling wildlife encounters from the comfort of their tent.

Governors' pioneered the "luxury tented camp" standard by emphasizing comfort and service, complimented by the sort of delicious cuisine which would have been impossible in the bygone days of the grand safari. With beautiful views over the Mara River and the open plains, Governors' Camp is visited and re-visited by those who find its consistent excellence, incredible location, personal style and family atmosphere a 'home' to return to again and again.

All the tents are crafted from canvas, preserving the authentic, traditional safari experience. Daily meals are enjoyed al fresco under the shade of a riverine forest in true Governors' fashion. At night, our guests are treated to the orchestral sounds of the bush while grazing animals brush up against their tents.

Eco-Tourism Kenya has awarded Governors' Camp a **GOLD** rating for its sustainability efforts and environmentally friendly practices.



## ACCOMMODATION

- Total of 24 x tented guest accommodations.
- 19 x classic safari tents (twins and doubles) (32 sq m) with views of the Mara River.
- 5 x family tents (174 sq m) look on to the plains. Each unit comprises two en-suite bedrooms which are connected by a central living area.
- 4 x guide tents available.
- Accessible tent numbers: 01, 03, 14, 16 & 18

## ACTIVITIES

### Daily game drives

Traditional (shared) game drives with a dedicated, highly qualified, and experienced guide. Up to three drives (per full day) are included in the accommodation price.

### Balloon safari

For an unforgettable and surreal experience, lift off in a hot air balloon at sunrise and drift over the Masai Mara landscape as the day breaks with a kaleidoscope of colours. The flight lasts approximately one hour, depending on weather conditions. The experience ends with a delicious bush breakfast cooked on balloon burners, with sparkling wine, and a leisurely game drive back to camp. This is an optional extra activity that can be booked in advance (suggested) or when in camp.

### Bush dinners

For a unique experience, enjoy the excitement of a bush dinner on the banks of the Mara River. A welcoming drink awaits by the warming campfire, followed by a delicious meal prepared by our chefs. The meal is served under the stars, with the soft lights of safari lanterns, accompanied by the sounds of the African night and the grunting Mara River hippos. Bush breakfasts and bush lunches are also available. They are charged as an extra.

### Cultural visits

Maasai cultural experiences at a nearby village (manyatta) can be arranged from camp or pre-booked, with a fee payable directly to the community.

### Community projects

Visits to our responsible tourism projects can be arranged from camp. The Mara Rianda Primary School and Mara Rianda Medical Centre are inspirational projects supported by Governors' Camp Collection. There is no cost to visit the project, but donations of any kind are welcome.



## *The Masai Mara*

One of the most remarkable African safari destinations, the Masai Mara is nearly unrivalled in its richness of wildlife.

The distinctive mottled landscape is a haven for an abundance of transitory and resident animals year-round. The beautifully dramatic setting combines with the game to make it a favourite for wildlife photographers and filmmakers alike.

The area around Governors' Camp, in particular, is renowned for consistently excellent game viewing. Elephants wander right through the camp, and big cats take down their prey just a short distance away.

Our resident lions, the Marsh Pride, whose story has been the focus of renowned wildlife documentaries, including *Big Cat Tales* and BBC Earth's *Dynasties*, have been featured repeatedly. Governors' has always been the top choice of accommodation for filmmakers and photographers. Other big cats, including leopards and cheetahs, many elephants, and a profusion of plains game ensure one of the most incredible safari experiences to be had.

From July to October, the Mara becomes a backdrop for one of the last great natural wonders of the world, when 1.5 million wildebeest and over 200,000 zebras surge up from the Serengeti plains in their annual search for the seasonal grasses that sustain them.

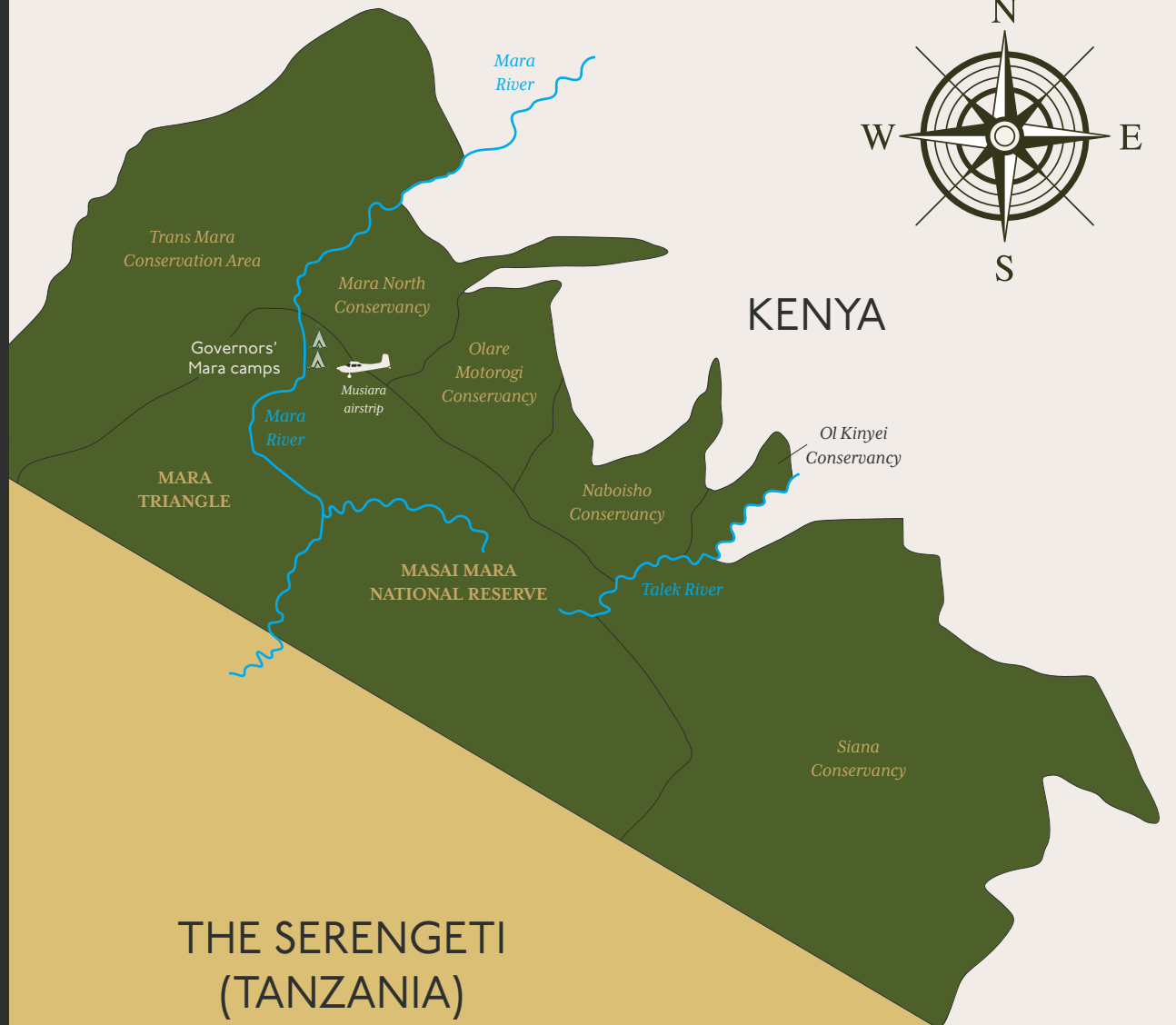

## GETTING THERE

**Governors' Aviation:** Daily scheduled flights from Nairobi Wilson Airport to Musiara Airstrip. Clients are met on arrival and transferred by game vehicle to the camp (approx. 5-10 minutes). Please see [www.governorsaviation.com](http://www.governorsaviation.com) for more details.

Other flight options: Air Kenya ([www.airkenya.com](http://www.airkenya.com)) or Safarilink ([www.flysafarilink.com](http://www.flysafarilink.com)) go daily from Wilson Airport in Nairobi.

Charter flights: Available with Governors' Aviation and other suppliers from most airports/airstrips in Kenya to Musiara Airstrip.

Luggage restrictions: Maximum **15 kg luggage restriction per person** (inclusive of hand luggage), in soft bags, for small aircraft.

Road transfer: duration approx. 5 - 6 hours (depending upon road conditions) from Nairobi.

### Family travel and children

Children of all ages are welcome and catered for with flexible meals and specially designed Family Tents, which are perfect for keeping your little ones close at night. We also offer the "Governors' Cub Club" (a kid's club) designed to excite and inspire our younger guests through fun and informative activities, providing your children with many happy lifetime memories.

### Inclusions and exclusions

**Rate includes** local Musiara Airstrip transfers, accommodation, meals, soft drinks, beers, house wines and 'non-premium' spirits, as well as up to three game drives (per full day) and laundry.

**Rate excludes** flights, champagnes, selected fine wines, premium spirits and liqueurs, park fees, community fees, and anything of a personal nature, e.g., gratuities, gift shop, spa, etc.

### Weather

Dry season: The driest months are from late June to October. Rainy season: The long rains in the Masai Mara last from April to May, while November (and the start of December) are known as the short rains.

The warmest month is February, with an average maximum temperature of 28°C (82°F). The coldest month is July, with an average maximum temperature of 24°C (75°F).

### Climate

- Altitude: The Masai Mara is around 6,000 ft.
- Due to the altitude, the climate in the Masai Mara is slightly colder and wetter than might be expected this close to the equator. Daytime is pleasant, with temperatures in the mid to upper twenties, while it cools off significantly at night. Mornings are chilly.

### Electronic Travel Authorisation (eTA)

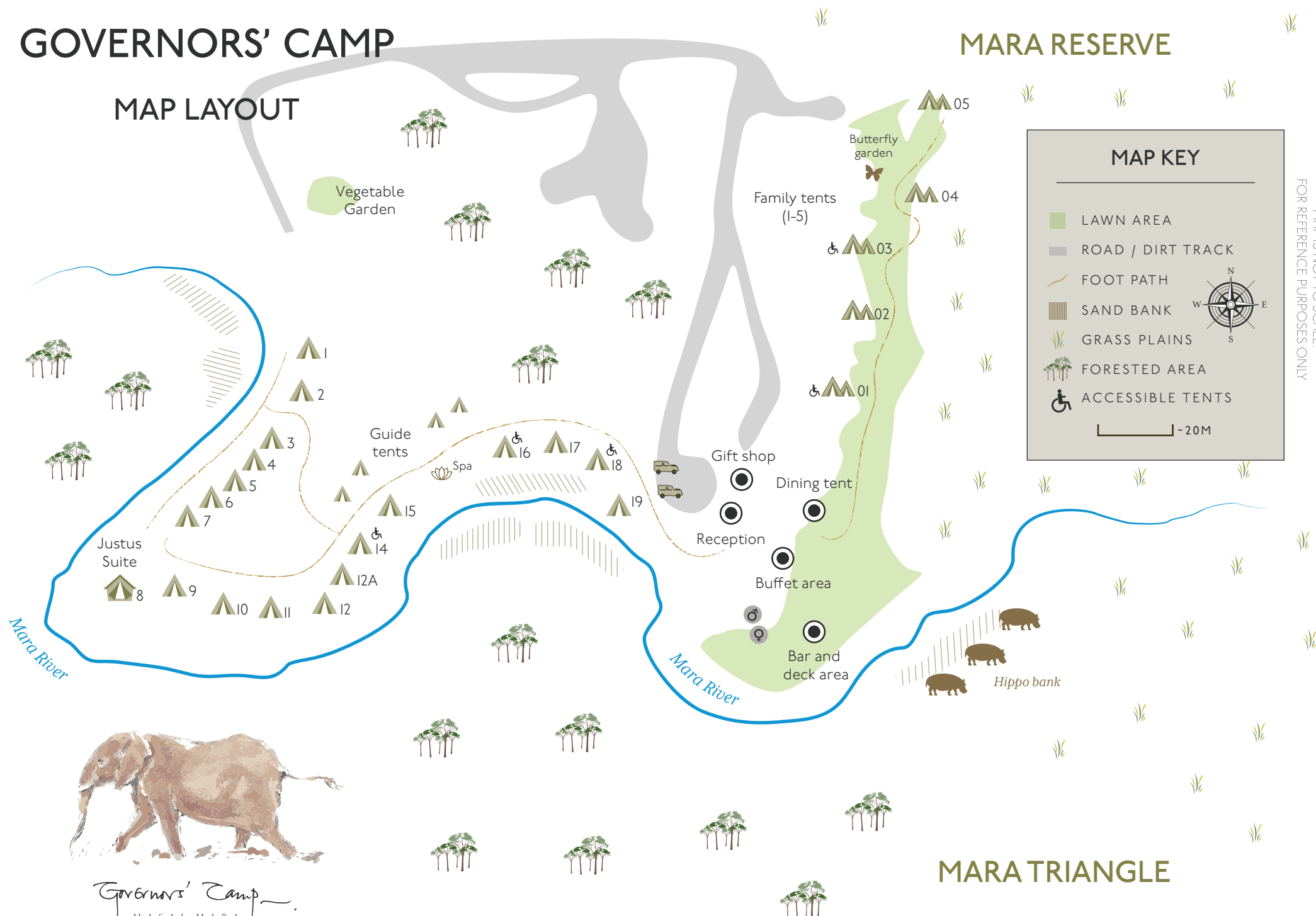
