Set within 74,000 acres (30,000 hectares) of pristine wilderness, Kwandwe Private Game Reserve is home to the famous Big Five as well as a diverse number of smaller and more unusual species. Thousands of animals, including Lion, Black and White Rhino, Buffalo, Elephant, and Cheetah, roam these expansive plains. The reserve is also a sanctuary to numerous other threatened and endangered species.
