



The Okonjima African Villa is situated in a secluded wilderness area, overlooking a natural waterhole that's ideal for wildlife photography and bird watching. The Okonjima Villa is situated inside the 55 000acre | 20 000 ha | 200km² private, nature reserve. This safari-chic, thatched villa has two en-suite, luxury bedrooms in the main house and two separate private, luxury mini suites, which together can accommodate up to eight adults and four children.

The main house consists of:

- Two en-suite luxury bedrooms.
- The 4th room at the Villa (courtyard view – family unit) can only be booked, if guests are related to the guests in the main room, for both suites are situated in the main building.
- A modern, chef-designed kitchen with wine and soft drink coolers, gas and electric cooking facilities and a double-door refrigerator with a built-in ice maker.
- A wood-burning fireplace that brings together the spacious lounge and dining areas.
- Each of the two en-suite, luxury bedrooms have an inside and outside shower as well as a bath with views of the Namibian bush.
- The infinity pool, which is necklaced by an African red teak deck, looks out onto the waterhole that's frequented by an abundance of wildlife.
- The open-air, shaded sala is the ideal setting for a meal or afternoon nap

The two private, luxury mini suites are situated 35-50 metres on either side of the main house and each boast:

- Double volume thatched roofs with air-con, fans and heating facilities.
- Glass-panelled sliding doors with panoramic views across Okonjima Nature Reserve.
- Should guests choose, these open doorways may be replaced with roll-down, zip-fastened canvas partitioning with heavy-duty gauze screens – to give you a true sense of staying in the untamed African bush.
- A well-stocked mini bar, as well as tea and coffee making facilities.
- The choice of an inside or outside shower, as well as bathrooms with bush views.
- Wi-Fi and ample workspace and private, undercover parking.

Okonjima Nature Reserve:

Nestled at the base of the Omboroko Mountains, the family-operated Okonjima Lodge is surrounded by acacia thornveld, in an area free from Malaria.

Located between Windhoek, Namibia's capital, and the Etosha National Park, the lodge offers convenient access. It's reachable with a mere two-and-a-half-hour drive or a swift one-hour flight from Windhoek to the private airstrip within the expansive 22,000-hectare (55,000-acre or 220 km²) nature reserve. Famed for the regular sightings of leopard, brown hyaena and pangolin during safaris, the Okonjima Nature Reserve is also the dwelling place of The AfriCat Foundation – founded in 1991 and officially registered as a private, not-for-profit, non-governmental organization (N.G.O.) in 1992.

AfriCat stands out for conducting one of Namibia's longest-running Leopard Monitoring Projects. Additionally, the AfriCat Pangolin Research Project is among the few initiatives worldwide dedicated to studying free-roaming pangolins. Committed to substantial conservation endeavours, AfriCat's dedication to safeguarding wildlife in their native habitat is profound. This commitment extends across the expansive 200km² Okonjima Nature Reserve.

The partnership between the Okonjima Lodges, the Okonjima Nature Reserve and the AfriCat Foundation is a demonstration of the symbiosis between conservation and tourism. Research by the AfriCat Foundation has confirmed that the Okonjima Nature Reserve is an ideal ecosystem for leopard, brown hyaena and pangolin. The Reserve is thus one of the best places in the country to see these normally shy and elusive animals.
