Set within the Maasai Mara's exclusive Naboisho Conservancy, eight elegant tents and two family villas overlook the sweeping wild plains.

Within the 50,000-acre community-owned Naboisho Conservancy, Ol Seki offers the rare luxury of space, seclusion and complete freedom. With just ten exclusive tents and a dedicated team to personalise every detail, each day unfolds entirely at your pace - whether exploring the bush on game drives and walks, enjoying quiet moments in camp, or simply soaking in the vastness of the wilderness.

Getting here is effortless. Scheduled daily flights from Nairobi's Wilson Airport to Naboisho Airstrip take just under an hour, followed by a short ten-minute game drive to camp, often with wildlife sightings along the way. Private charters are also available for those seeking maximum flexibility.

Each elegant safari tent is thoughtfully positioned to maximise sweeping views across the plains. Designed to blend canvas and character with contemporary comfort, interiors feature spacious ensuite bathrooms, calming colour palettes, and subtle touches of Kenyan design that create a stay both restful and refined.

Accommodation at Ol Seki blends modern comfort with a deep sense of place. Floor-to-ceiling glass doors open onto private terraces, blending the indoors with the surrounding landscape, while natural textures and refined architectural lines inside create a serene, contemporary retreat.

For families or travellers seeking added space and privacy, two exclusive villas provide a more expansive retreat. Each features two ensuite bedrooms, a central lounge and dining area, a kitchenette, and a private terrace with plunge pool - perfect for wildlife viewing by day and stargazing by night.

Whether in a luxury tent or a private villa, every stay at Ol Seki is crafted to honour the surrounding wilderness while offering the ease and elegance of modern safari living.



After a day on safari, guests are invited to slow down and unwind at the on-site Fig Tree spa, a tranquil space set against the vast beauty of the Mara.

Curated Dining



Overlooking the expansive Naboisho Conservancy, our open-air restaurant offers a welcoming space to enjoy every meal, from a fresh breakfast at sunrise to dinner under the stars.

Guests are invited to choose from an à la carte menu that changes with the seasons, featuring a variety of international favourites and locally inspired dishes. Whether it's grilled meats, vibrant salads, or comforting classics, each dish is thoughtfully prepared using the freshest ingredients.

Meals are served in a setting that reflects the rhythm of the bush, unhurried, scenic and deeply satisfying.

Start the day with a bush breakfast surrounded by birdsong and wide-open plains. Return to camp for a light, al fresco lunch overlooking the landscape, and wind down with sundowners by the fire before a three-course dinner in the dining tent. For an unforgettable evening, opt for a bush dinner beneath the stars accompanied by the sounds of the wild, or a candlelit cave dinner back at camp - an intimate, atmospheric experience for two that is truly unique.

At Ol Seki, dining is more than a meal, it's an invitation to pause, connect, and savour the beauty of the wild.



At Hemingways Ol Seki, every safari is tailored to you, from immersive game drives and bush walks with a maasai warrior to cultural encounters and moments of stillness in the wild.

Activities

Whether it's your first time in the Mara or a return journey, our team ensures a seamless and enriching experience throughout your stay.

Game drives are available at dawn and dusk, when wildlife is most active, though there is no fixed schedule. Guests are free to head out as often or as little as they like with our expert guides, exploring the wide open plains of the Naboisho Conservancy at their own pace. Known for its remarkable concentration of lions, the conservancy offers exceptional big cat sightings, as well as elephants, giraffes, cheetahs and an abundance of plains game. Every encounter feels personal, unhurried, and deeply memorable.



For those seeking a deeper connection with nature, guided bush walks offer a slower, more sensory experience, following animal tracks, learning about medicinal plants, listening to birdsong, and absorbing the stillness of the savannah.

Cultural visits to a nearby Maasai village offer a powerful opportunity to engage with the custodians of this landscape, sharing stories, traditions, and the vital relationship between community and conservation. For a breathtaking perspective, a sunrise hot air balloon safari over the Maasai Mara offers a moment of wonder as the plains come to life below.

Ol Seki is also an inspiring destination for families. Safari here is flexible and welcoming for all ages, with junior bush walks, animal tracking with Maasai guides, storytelling around the fire, and child-friendly dining. Family villas provide privacy and space, while tailored activities ensure younger guests feel just as engaged and curious. With gentle guidance and thoughtful attention from our team, children are invited to explore the magic of the bush in their own way.



Between July and October, guests have the chance to witness one of nature's greatest spectacles — the Great Migration.

Witness the Great Migration



For those wishing to see dramatic Mara River crossings, we arrange full-day excursions into the Maasai Mara Reserve, complete with early starts, picnic lunches, and expert guiding, returning to camp by sunset.

The Maasai Mara is a year-round safari destination. January to March is warm and dry with excellent predator sightings. The long rains arrive in April and May, bringing dramatic skies and fewer crowds. June to October is peak season, coinciding with the Great Migration and generally dry weather. Short rains in November and December revive the landscape and offer beautiful light for photography.



Set within the Naboisho Conservancy, Hemingways Ol Seki is dedicated to protecting the land and supporting the communities who call it home.

Conservation & Community Impact

Almost 80% of our team are from neighbouring Maasai villages, and we work closely with the Koiyaki Guiding School to mentor the next generation of safari guides.

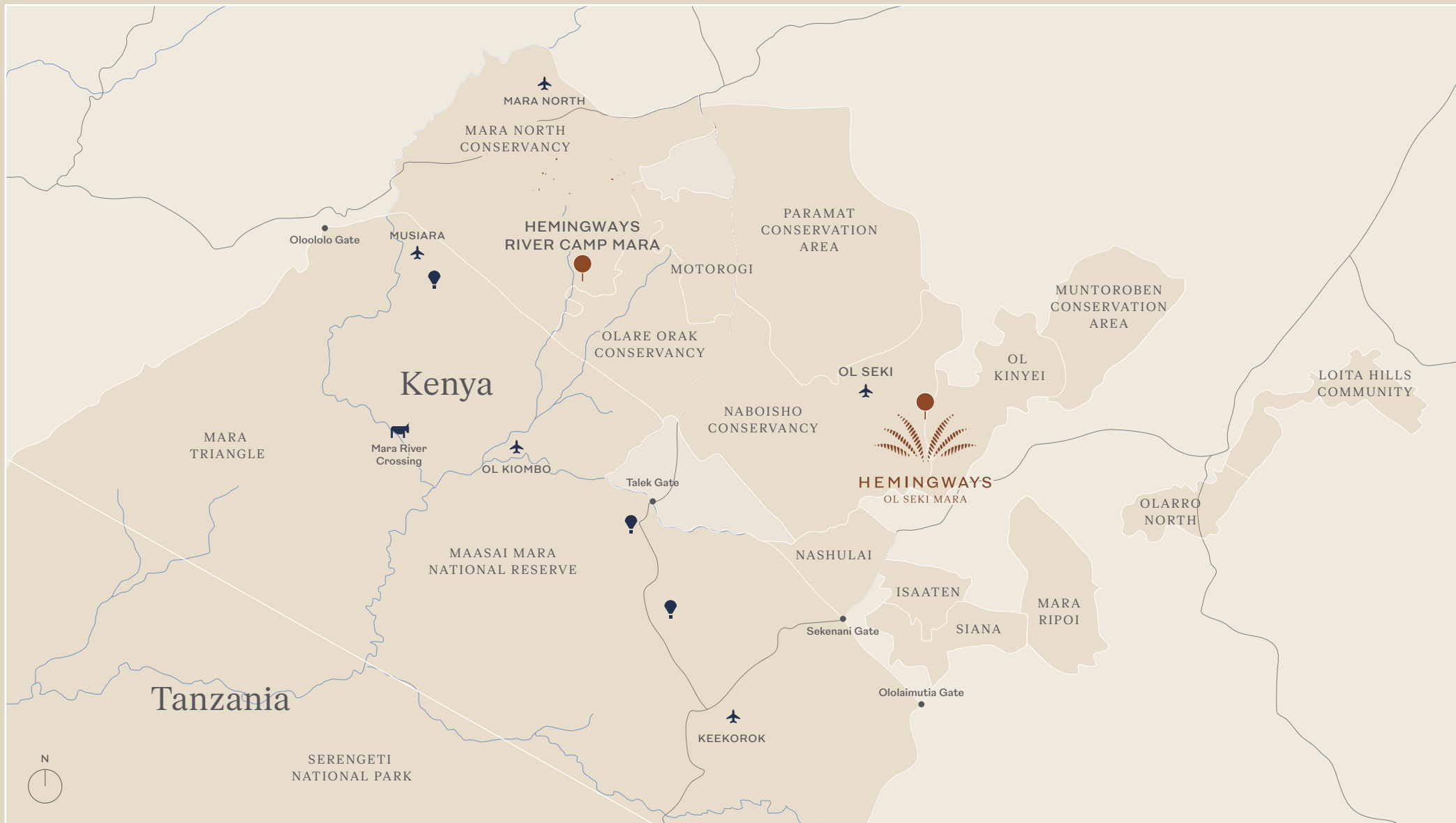
