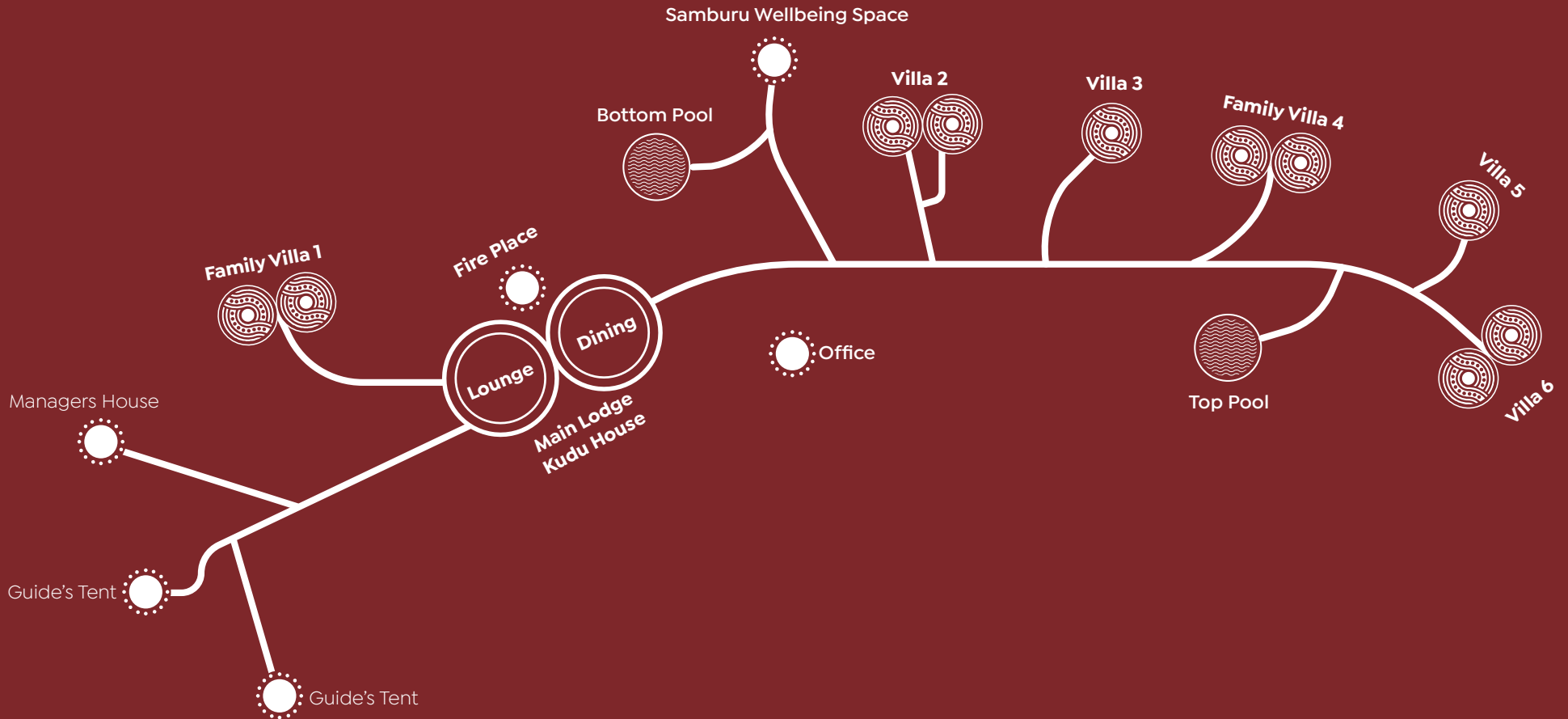

Saruni Samburu works together with the Northern Rangelands Trust to improve the living conditions for the 2,000 local Samburu people who own the Kalama Conservation Area, and is providing them with income generated by tourism for the first time in their history. Saruni Samburu is committed to employing most of our staff from this small community. At least 90% of the employees are local Samburu men and women and are trained by the lodge.
