The Republic of the Congo, a former French colony that gained independence in 1960, is often confused with its neighbor, the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC). Despite sharing part of a name, the two have always been separate nations, divided by the world's deepest river, the mighty Congo River. The DRC has a population of over 105 million - far exceeding the Republic of the Congo's 6 million, with two-thirds of ROC's people living in major cities, far from the remote wilderness of the Congo Basin and where Kamba operates in Odzala-Kokoua National Park.
