Caring for Frail Guests

The team at Angama Amboseli prides itself on taking care of frail and elderly guests. We understand the challenges facing travellers who want to experience the magic of a safari trip in Africa but require special accommodations.



WE HAVE THE FOLLOWING INFRASTRUCTURE AND CAPABILITIES TO LOOK AFTER THESE VALUED GUESTS AT ANGAMA AMBOSELI:

- We are pleased to accommodate guests using wheelchairs, with ramps for easy access to both the main entrance and Guest Suites
- All Guest Suites are designed specifically with accessibility in mind for guests with physical limitations, without sacrificing any special touches or comforts including modifications such as grab rails and ramps (please note there are no support rails in the bathrooms)
- The Guest Suites and Guest Areas are spacious to ensure ease of access for guests who are frail or have mobility challenges, and floor space is clear of unnecessary furniture
- Pathways throughout the lodge, between the Guest Suites, Guest Area and vehicle drop-off points, are made of compacted murram soil, making them suitable for wheelchair use and easy walking
- Transfers to and from the lodge are made in our safari vehicles, which are equipped with portable steps to make it easier for guests to get in and out
- A road transfer from Nairobi to the lodge is available for guests who prefer not to fly. The journey is 3.5 hours long in a comfortable transfer vehicle equipped with AC and WiFi. For the last leg of the drive and a leisurely start to the safari experience, guests can opt to switch to an open safari vehicle once they reach the gates of Kimana Sanctuary

- Guests are also gently lifted into the front seat of the safari vehicle for game drives
- Suites 7, 8, 9 and 10 are directly accessible by vehicles
- Our staff are trained to be able to carefully lift or support guests in and out of the aircraft, should they prefer to fly
- We would strongly recommend that wheelchair-bound guests charter a larger aircraft that has a loading door these aircraft also have their back seats right at the loading door, meaning that guests will be much more comfortable

Please note the following:

- We require wheelchair-bound guests to be accompanied by full-time professional carers. We can certainly assist with helping guests get around the camp and in and out of the safari vehicles, but care of a more personal nature needs to be provided by a professional
- Our lodge is unfortunately not suitable for wheelchair-bound guests who are not able to stand at all
- Guests requiring Zimmer frames or walking sticks to get around the camp will always be accommodated in suites near the Guest Areas (please be sure to tell us beforehand)
- At this time, we unfortunately do not have a patient turner available at the lodge
