



JANUARY

APRIL - MAY

JUNE

The grass is tall in June (waist-high) after the rains, reducing in height as months go on. Lack of vehicles and plentiful game. Rivers mostly dry, still some water in Great Ruaha River.

JULY

Cheetah and wild dog can be particularly good this time of year but varies each season so hard to predict. Lion is active but more spread out. Grass becoming lower so visibility increases. Seasonal balloon safaris are now possible.

AUGUST

August is traditionally good for cat sighting, particularly lion and leopard. Buffalo come down from escarpment in herds of between 10 – 1000. Elephants digging in dry riverbeds. Landscapes becoming arid, lots of combretum flowers.

SEPTEMBER

Great sightings of cats are still possible and again lion and leopard being the most prevalent. It is still possible to see those large buffalo herds and in general the wildlife is becoming concentrated around waterholes and riverbeds.

OCTOBER

Peak dry season, outstanding game viewing. Great for cat sightings – lion, leopard and cheetah. Seasonal balloon safaris operate until the end of the month.

NOVEMBER

The peak of dry season continues into Nov. Even as the short rains approach, they are not yet sufficient to disperse the wildlife, creating excellent walking and game viewing conditions. Expect some afternoon showers late in the month.
