Immerse yourself in the untamed beauty of the Zambezi National Park at Chamabondo Tented Camp. Nestled on the edge of the private Chamabondo pans, this intimate 24-bed camp offers a unique safari experience in an authentic tented setting.

Imagine waking up to the sounds of the African bush and gazing out at a busy waterhole and the Chamabondo pans. The main area boasts an expansive viewing deck, perfect for spotting elephants and buffalo while you cool off in the refreshing swimming pool. Unwind under the shade of indigenous trees like Msasa, Umtshibi, and Marula, and gather around a crackling campfire in the boma after an exhilarating game drive.

Your luxurious haven awaits. Dotted amongst the lush greenery are 12 beautifully appointed tents, each featuring a private deck and captivating views of the grassy plains. Step inside and discover a tranquil space furnished with calming sandy beige tones and earthy hues, reminiscent of the surrounding bushveld.

Embark on unforgettable adventures. Experience the thrill of two daily game drives, venturing out at first light and in the late afternoon when the wilderness comes alive. Witness the majestic predators emerge as the sun sets, painting the sky in vibrant hues.

- All tents have an indoor shower




FACILITIES

- Viewing and swimming pool deck overlooking the seasonal pans
- Boma area with firepit, chairs, and bushveld views floodlit waterhole in front of the camp
- Tented Indaba lounge, dining and bar area with tea and coffee station

- Solar power and green energy
- Each tent has a mosquito net, standing fan & canvas drop down sides, private deck, universal plug points, bedside tables with lighting, indoor showers
- Each kingsize bed can be made into twin beds

A TYPICAL DAY AT CHAMBONDO


an example of a typical day on safari at Chamabondo which may vary according to seasons



LOCATION

Chambondo is located in the famed Zambezi National Park with unfenced borders right on the doorstep of the majestic Victoria Falls. If you're self-driving, from Victoria Falls, it takes an estimated 45 minutes to reach the Chamabondo Tented Camp pick up point.

Most safari-goers choose to fly into Victoria Falls and then catch a connecting road transfer. All transfers can be arranged through our reservations department.



ACTIVITIES

Game Drives: Two game drives are offered per day, one in the morning and one in late afternoon that moves into the night. All game drives are conducted in open 4x4 game viewers.

Sundowners and Coffee Stops: On the morning drive there is a stop for coffee and on afternoon drive you will stop for sundowners. Stops usually take place in scenic, open areas. Sundowners are typically accompanied by a few snacks.

Bushwalks: As an alternative to a game drive, head on out foot for a bushwalk. Walks can be booked with the receptionist.

Birding: Chamabondo has great birdlife all year, but birding is best from November to April when the European and north African migratory birds have arrived. This is a good time to see resident birds in their colorful breeding plumage.

Zambezi River Cruise: Book a cruise down the mighty Zambezi River. As the sun dips below the horizon, enjoy a sundowner, making the Zambezi River cruise an unforgettable adventure



WEATHER

Summer (November - April): Witness the park transformed into a lush green landscape. A haven for birdwatchers with migratory species flocking from across the globe from November to April. Enjoy breathtaking sunsets with vibrant skies after refreshing afternoon rain showers and relax at a waterhole. Chamabondo is malaria free.

Winter (May - August): Winters are just perfect ...warm days and cool nights provide comfortable exploration. The bush is thinner and increases visibility which enhances game viewing opportunities. Witness the exciting drama as waterholes become magnets for thirsty animals, including many elephants and big cats.

WILDLIFE

Keep your binoculars handy as a vibrant array of birdlife frequents the waterhole, while giraffe and elephants quench their thirst. Impala graze nearby, and with a bit of luck, you might even spot a predator on the prowl. While encounters with the legendary lion, leopard, elephant and buffalo are a thrilling possibility, the Zambezi National Park boasts a magnificent diversity beyond the Big 5. Keep your eyes peeled for kudu, baboons, vervet monkeys, hyena, wild dogs and hippos to complete the unforgettable tapestry of the African savanna.

WHAT TO PACK

Safaris take place in open-topped game viewers, so be prepared with warm clothes during the cold season and hats in summer.

- Comfortable walking shoes
- Sun hat, sunglasses and sunblock
- Cameras and binoculars
- Light, neutral coloured clothing
- Swimming costume
- Warm jackets, beanies and gloves essential in winter
