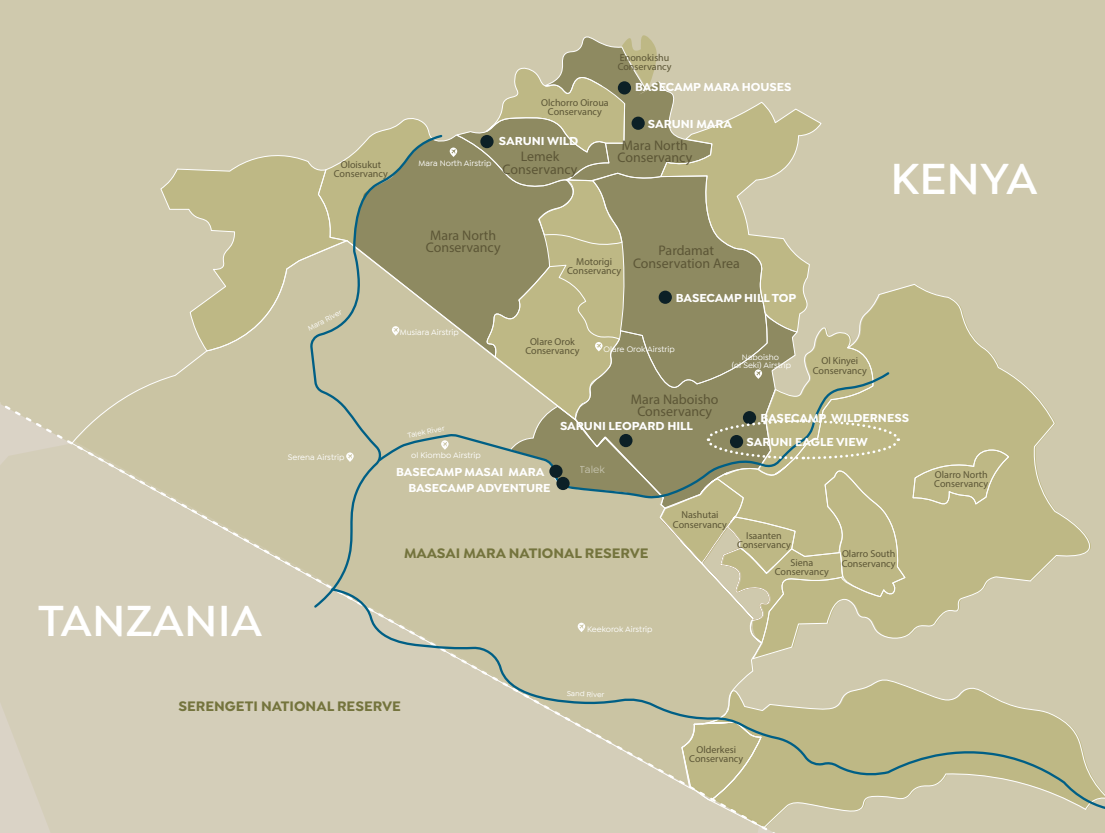

INTRODUCING SARUNI EAGLE VIEW

As its name suggests, Saruni Eagle View offers a remarkable perspective not just on the Masai Mara itself, but on our efforts to support protection and preservation initiatives in this remarkable area. The hilltop location of Saruni Eagle View offers endless vistas over the Koiyaki Plains, as well as the chance to view wildlife coming to drink at the waterhole immediately in front of the camp. The Mara Naboisho Conservancy within which the camp is situated is itself a pioneering conservation success story. The area is known for its very high density of lions, making Saruni Eagle View a hotspot for predator viewing. Whichever way you look at it, this is a must-visit safari destination.

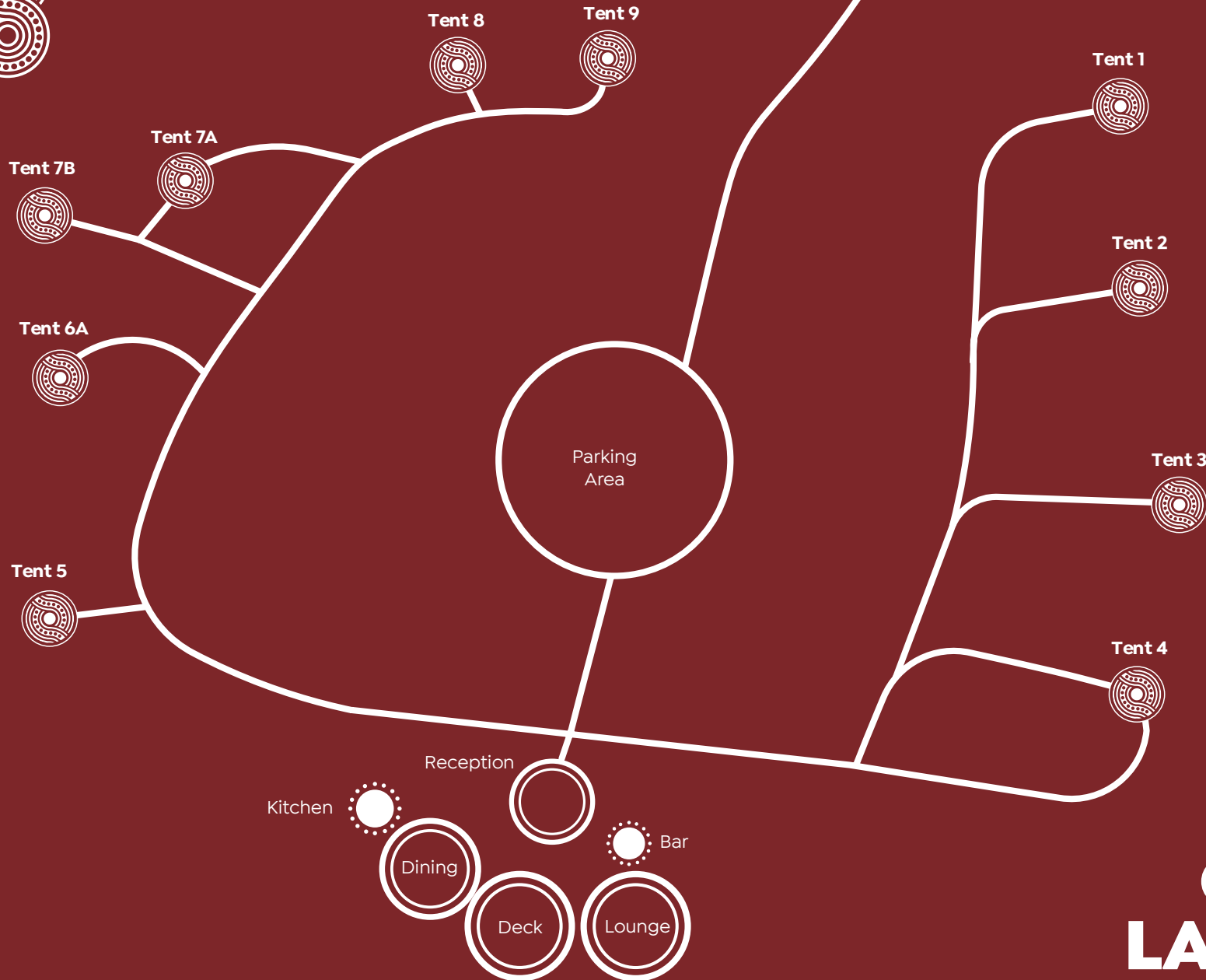

- The majority of the team members at Saruni Eagle View are Maasai from the local communities. They are trained and employed to enable local communities to benefit directly from the camp being in their area.
- Opportunities are provided for local artisans to sell their craft items, giving them an alternative revenue stream and contributing to the revival of interest in traditional skills.
- Saruni Basecamp sponsors young Maasai to train as guides at the Wildlife Tourism College of Maasai Mara, and lead future generations of conservationists and safari guides.
- The camp helps to protect the Masai Mara ecosystem, and contributes to the preservation of the Mara Naboisho Conseruancy.
