



WHERE IS JACANA CAMP

19° 16.805'S 22° 36.572'E

Jacana Camp sits on a remote island in the heart of the Okavango Delta, within the 60,000-ha Jao Reserve on the edge of Moremi Game Reserve. A water-based camp, it's surrounded by seasonal floodplains and papyrus-lined waterways.

WHEN IS A GOOD TIME TO GO

Best time to visit Jacana Camp is June - October. June - August is high-water season - ideal for mokoro and boat safaris through lush channels. September - October sees receding waters and excellent land-based game drives with concentrated wildlife (October can be very hot). November - April is the green season - great for birding and newborns and generally more budget-friendly despite occasional rains.

HOW DO I GET THERE

There are direct international flights to Maun, from where you will take a small charter plane to Jacana Camp and the Jao Reserve. The camp is accessed via the Jao Airstrip, followed by a short 30-minute transfer, offering a seamless arrival into one of Africa's most extraordinary areas.

WHERE WILL I STAY

Jacana Camp has five secluded Meru-style tents on raised wooden decks on a small island. Each tent offers a private deck with scenic floodplain and papyrus views, en-suite bathrooms with indoor/outdoor or roofless star-gazing showers, and an intimate water-based safari feel.

WHAT WILL I EAT

At Jacana Camp meals are buffet-style and freshly prepared, with light breakfasts (muffins, toast) before morning activities and gourmet dinners served under the stars. Dining takes place in an elevated, open-sided two-storey main area overlooking the floodplains and around the campfire, featuring local flavours (e.g. seswaa, pap, morogo) and a well-stocked bar. Special dietary

requirements can usually be accommodated with advance notice.

FULLY INCLUSIVE RATE INCLUDES

Airstrip transfers, all meals, daily activities (some exclusions apply), local drinks and laundry are included. Excluded are flights, discretionary tips/gratuities, personal items and personal travel insurance.

WHAT ARE THE FACILITIES

The two-storey main lodge offers an open-air dining area, bar and lounge, plus a plunge pool with sun loungers and a shaded hammock area. Evenings center around an intimate boma campfire, and the camp also has a gift shop and library; the intimate camp is 100% solar-powered.

WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW

Children of all ages are welcome (see rates for child policies). Tents have 24-hour electricity, with in-room charging and camp Wi-Fi. Game vehicles are open-rooftop and seat up to seven guests.

WHAT WILL I DO HERE

At Jacana Camp you'll enjoy water-based safaris from a remote island base: mokoro excursions through reed-lined channels, motorboat safaris to deeper waterways, game drives, guided walks, excellent birding (including Pel's fishing owl) and catch-and-release fishing. Relax between activities at the pool and two-storey main lounge with bar.
