School donation: From US\$20 per person

Many of our camps offer the opportunity to visit a neighbouring community and spend an afternoon learning about local culture and visiting schools, all of which are supported by Asilia through our scholarship and schools programme. On arrival, guests are taken on a guided walk of the town or village gaining valuable insight into local life. Meet the residents and learn about the history of the region while understanding the culture of daily life. Each village is different — you may have the chance to watch fishermen return with their catch at Matemwe or Rubondo, or visit a vibrant market where guests can purchase local produce and souvenirs.

Due to logistics, many of the trips need to be pre-booked at reservation with some requiring the booking and cost of a private vehicle and re-entry permits into the park. Please see the below table for more information. School visits includes a minimum donation of US\$20 per person so each trip contributes to the community. We cannot guarantee school visits as term dates fluctuate and close for weekends, public holidays and exams. Our visits should offer minimal disruption to school life so learning takes priority. Therefore, we only organise visits only during lunch and break time, offering guests a chance to talk to students and teachers, and maybe even get in a game of football or hide and seek.




Asilia wants to ensure that travel and cultural visits are educational and used as a force for good. We discourage physical donations such as pens, pencils or footballs. We have seen first-hand how it only benefits a small number of children, can create a culture of bullying and even on occasion a black market. Alternatively, we encourage guests to save their 15 kgs of luggage allowance and instead make a donation to the school or community through AsiliaGiving. Donations are 100 percent guaranteed to be spent on longer-term projects that benefit more than one child. Donations contribute to Asilia's current annual endowment of more than US\$50,000 to Kamitei Foundation, which

provides educational support to more than 14 partner communities, as well as provide vital funding for desks and school equipment and continued funding for 70 individual scholarships.

If guests choose to bring physical items to share, we kindly request they are left at camp and the managers will use them for the next *Twende Porini*, a homegrown Asilia project whereby we welcome children from local communities to our camps for five days to experience life in the bush or at the beach while learning the importance of protecting our wildlife and conserving the areas we call home.

Meet Naati

Naiti, was just 12 years old when she ran away to seek help after plans were made to marry her to a 55-year-old man to help reduce the financial burden on her family. With Asilia's support, she was given a scholarship, meaning she not only can attend school and get an education, but will also help her family when she enters the job market as a result of her education.
