Travel Information & Requirements

Pre Travel Requirements

- ◆ A negative COVID-19 Real Time Polymerase Chain Reaction (RT-PCR) test, taken within 48 hours (2 days) of arrival.
- ◆ The time-frame of 48 hours is from the time the swab was taken and the time you hand your certificate over to authorities on arrival at the immigration gate of your destination country. It may mean that further tests are required en route for multi destinations and itineraries will have to take that into account.

Arrival Requirements

- ◆ Present the results of the test at the airport. If you do not have a negative test result, or if you exhibit COVID-19 like symptoms on arrival, you will be detained for testing (USD 60 per test).
- ◆ Depending on the results, you may have to self-isolate at a designated address.

Departure Requirements

- ◆ Destination country requirements must be taken into account by agent/guest prior to departure and itineraries planned accordingly.

PCR Testing Facilities

Lancet Laboratories (Victoria Falls and Harare) & Dr Mike Jeans (Victoria Falls)

Cost of Tests

Lancet: USD60 Dr Jeans: USD120 (Test, doctor call out fee, medical admin fee)

In-Room Testing

In-lodge/hotel room testing (RT-PCR) is possible in the Victoria Falls area only (including the airport).

Results

Within 24 hours results can be emailed and the Certificates will be available to collect at Lancet Laboratories and in Victoria Falls, Dr Jeans will deliver to in-room patients.

Quarantine Facilities

(mild/asymptomatic) There are currently government approved private facilities.

Treatment Facilities

(severe symptoms) At the time of print, the Port Health Authorities are allowing evacuations to South Africa, this would be our first priority - to medically evacuate a patient to Johannesburg, at their own cost.
