

LEWA WILDLIFE CONSERVANCY

Lewa is a 62,000 acre private wildlife conservancy, famous for its black rhino conservation.

Game drives are exciting and rewarding, with good changes of spotting some of the unique wildlife species to Northern Kenya, including Grevy's zebra, Reticulated giraffe, Somali ostrich, gerenuk, Greater kudu, Beisa oryx. Cheetah and lion also roam the plains. Nature walks, picnics and sundowners are also on offer.



SIRIKOI

A spectacular game lodge surrounded by the Lewa Wildlife Conservancy in Northern Kenya, beautifully set within a shady acacia grove overlooking a natural waterhole.

MOUNT KENYA

An ancient extinct volcano, standing over 5000 metres tall, in the heart of Kenya, with rugged peaks, glacial valleys & forested slopes.

> This is Africa's 2nd highest mountain, after Mount Kilimanjaro.

Fly fishing on an alpine lake

Lake Michelson is one of our favourite spots. Almost inaccessible by foot, and well off the beaten track, the lake is located in a deep crater which falls away to a spectacular valley.

We land on the shore, and in this stunning setting, surrounded by beautiful views and unique mountain flora, we fly-fish for rainbow trout.





SCENIC FLIGHT OVER LAIKIPIA

on route to Lake Bogoria

Stunning savannah plains - the epitome of what Africa is all about!

This region, known as Laikipia, is one of the few areas in Kenya with sufficient habitat and space to support significant numbers of large mammals. Here wildlife moves freely across a landscape, shared with people.



GREAT RIFT VALLEY LAKE BOGORIA

Flamingo & bubbling hot springs

Bogoria is a shallow alkaline lake with a salinity about twice that of seawater. It is most famous for its millions of flamingo that line the white salty shores.

200 geysers & hot springs are dotted around the shoreline.

Flying over the Ewaso Nyiro River


Ewaso Nyiro River flows constantly - it represents life for the people, livestock and wildlife of the arid north.

Northern Kenya's most striking landmark visible from miles away .. rising abruptly 1000 meters above the plains



MATHEWS RANGE

Picnic breakfast & walk in the ancient cycad forest

Known as a 'sky island', the 150km long Mathews Range rises from the dry desolate country exposing lush forested hills and craggy peaks.

Natural springs and rivers flow through the valleys, and sacred sites of the Samburu lay hidden for feasting and dancing ceremonies.

SINGING WELLS

Visit to the amazing singing wells, Samburu

The singing wells are an assured watering point for many northern pastoralist communities. During the drought, they dig deep into the earth, and bail out water for their livestock. It's an amazing privilege to visit these wells - and meet the people whose lives depend on these treasured sites.





SAVE THE ELEPHANTS

Visit to this inspiring conservation programme

Kenya's Samburu region covers an area of 21,000 km². It stretches north from the Ewaso Nyiro River to the southern shores of Lake Turkana.

Herds of elephants and the big cats roam the plains, along side Reticulated giraffe, Grevy's zebra, Beisa oryx, Somali ostrich and the long necked gerenuk.

Save the Elephants (STE) is dedicated to securing a future for elephants in Northern Kenya. They have followed these herds for over 40 years, and know each and every individual by name, family and personality.


STE gives us a privileged insight into the intricate lives of elephants and their fascinating social behaviour.

РОКОТ

A visit the Pokot nomadic pastoralists. These people are independent and conservative by nature, the Pokot have deep rooted cultural systems of governance. They live in a remote and desolate part of the Suguta Valley, just north of Lake Baringo.





SUGUTA VALLEY

Geologists have long been fascinated with this part of the Great Rift Valley. They have studied ancient sediments and fossil remains, and pieced together the history of a lake that rose and fell multiple times over the past 18,000 years.




PAINTED VALLEY

We have named this area 'the painted valley', because of the multiple colours in the eroded landscape over the past 18,000 years.

LAKE LOGIPI

Lake Logipi, a saline seasonal lake - often full of flamingoes - lies at the southern end of Lake Turkana. The lake is about 6km wide by 3 kms long, and very shallow.




LAKE TURKANA

The world's largest permanent desert lake, Turkana, is wild in character with its parched volcanic beaches, granite outcrops and lava flows. The lake's shores have revealed some of the world's oldest fossil finds – from dinosaurs to early Man – discovered by the famous palaeontologists – the Leakey family.



MOUNT NYIRO

Mount Nyiro – surrounded by desert, with its summit reaching over 3,000 metres, is densely forested and provides water and dry-weather feeding grounds for the Samburu pastoralists.



DESERT ROSE

A unique hand-crafted retreat, perched on the remote forested slopes of Mount Nyiro.

Designed around various natural features with dramatic views and lush indigenous gardens, with its easy access to sand dunes of the Suguta Valley and the shores of Lake Turkana, the lodge is a perfect night stop for our heli-safaris.
